God is a strong and faithful LORD. He generously displays His strength and faithfulness to men and women whose hope is riveted to Him. One of the ways that gospel men and women demonstrate faith is in prayer. Though few men and women of faith would dispute the importance of the discipline of prayer, practically there are many believers who in their most honest moments would admit that frequently prayer is a "last resort." In other words, after I have done all I can do, then I resort to prayer. That is why the story of a king in Judah named Jehoshaphat can be so valuable. Under siege, and in the face of a perilous challenge, he made prayer his first move. In the face of a daunting challenge, he chose to pray first. The bottom line is that in his distress, he nevertheless had clarity about whose battle it is, and who has power to save and deliver. What can we learn from this king of Judah? Moreover, what practical encouragement can we offer one another as we celebrate the power and grace of God, and His resolve to work on behalf of people who wait for Him. This is the first week of a 7-week teaching series we have titled, "Prayer First."



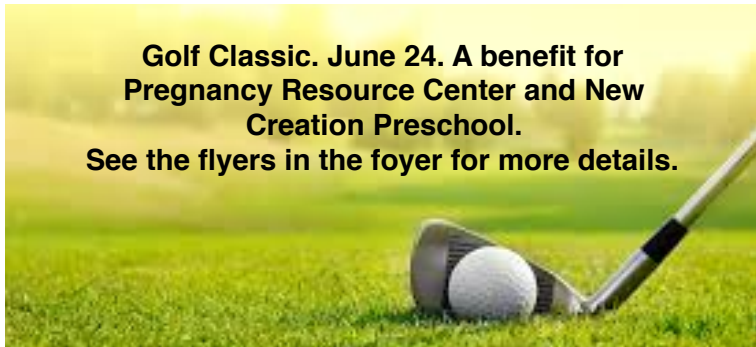
Concert of Prayer

Sunday Evenings starting June 25. 6:30-7:45 PM.
Over 300 years ago, Christians in Scotland would gather together to pray for a mighty move of God. They called their gatherings, "Concerts of Prayer." These gatherings focused on three priorities - adoration of God, awakening in His Church, and advance of the gospel in the world. The Greek word for agreement is "sumphoneo," from which we get our English word, 'symphony.' The idea was that as believers united in prayer about priorities on the heart of God, it would be like a symphony, or a concert, where all the players in the prayer gathering were submitting to a score written by God with the LORD Himself as the symphony conductor. On Sunday evening, June 25, we are planning to gather as a community at Mountain View to go hard after God in united prayer. Please consider joining us at 6:30 PM that evening in the worship center.

Weekly Corporate Prayer Gathering

Beginning June 27, we are planning to begin a weekly corporate prayer gathering from 6:30-7:45 PM each Tuesday evening through the summer. Pastor Tim will facilitate these corporate prayer gatherings. We plan to practice Scripture-fed, Spirit-led, worship-based prayer. For the first several Tuesday evenings together, we will explain what we mean by that and why we are intent on prayer times shaped by those priorities. We will meet in the Sunlight Peak Room, except for the second Tuesday of the month when we will meet in the worship center.

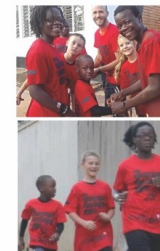
